GIVE-BOX

First 3-day Training for the trainers for exchange of good practice, green skills and innovative non-formal learning tools (A 1.)

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Give-box is a place (most often resembling a closet, usually made of recycled materials) where people leave all sorts of things they don't need: clothes, books, DVDs, electrical appliances, toys, dishes... And take the things they need.

People give and take freely, but also give without taking and take without giving.

- reuse


REUSE

- reuse means recovering and reusing products or their components
- extends the life cycle of a product
- saves resources
- reduction and reuse are the most effective ways you can save natural resources, protect the environment, and save money

Pre-activity: waste management/zero waste education

Based on 4 goals:

- waste reduction
- 2. reuse
- 3. recycling
- 4. composting

GIVE-BOX: INSTRUCTIONS FOR CONSTRUCTION AND USE

- use recycled materials to construct your give-box (e.g. old closets, wooden pallets, shelves, even suitcases or cardboard boxes...)
- place it in a public space: street, park, school, your workplace etc.
- write guidelines/rules to explain how it works: e.g. leave only whole, functioning items in good condition
- there can be a notebook for people to write down their name when they leave and/or take something

2. KUTIJA ZA DIJELJENJE (GIVE-BOX)

UVODNA KARTICA:

Što je give box?

Princip: ponovno upotrebljena stvar = smanjenje nastanka otpada

Give box je velika, otvorena kutija smještena u javni prostor gdje učenici mogu ostaviti i uzeti rabljene predmete (odjeća, knjige, grice, stripovi, igračke, nakit...). To može biti stari ormar, police, kutije, palete - ima jako puno mogućnosti. U prilogu su fotografije koje mogu biti izvor ideja.

Što nam je potrebno: Lokacija koja je javno dostupna i gdje je velik protok ljudi. Hodnik, čekaonica, natkriveno dvorište i sl. Police ili kutije od kojih ćemo na praviti "give box". Važno da se radi o ponovnoj uporabi - iskoristiti stari namještaj, palete, karton i sl. Plakat ili oglasna ploča - na kojoj je objašnjeno o čemu se radi i koji je princip korištenja, uz sam give - box. Bilježnica u koju će učenici upisati kad nešto ostave (datum i što su ostavili). Bilježnica treba biti vezana ili oričvršćena.

PITANJA:

- Odredite lokaciju u školi gdje biste mogli smjestiti give-box?
- Razmislite koje materijale možete iskoristiti za svoj give-box? Što imate kod kuće? Što u i oko škole?
 Popišite te materijale.
- Osmislite izgled give-boxa. Nacrtajte skicu.
- 4. Koji vam još materijali i alati trebaju? (boje, lakovi, ljepila, tkanine...) Tko vam može posuditi alat ili dati neki materijal? Tko vam može pomoći?
- 5. Isplanirajte kako, kada i gdje biste mogli imati radionice izrade give-boxa. U školi, kod kuće u grupama? U sklopu eko-grupe ili tehničkog?
- 6. Kako čete prezentirati projekt i pravila korištenja give-boxa? Društvene mreže ili plakat, letak?
- 7. Osmislite tekst predstavljanja give-boxa i pravila.
- 8. Treba vam i bilježnica za u pisivanje učenika koji donose stvari u give-box. Kakva bilježnica, gdje ćete je staviti, kako ćete je pričvrstiti za give-box?
- 9. Koliko volontera vam treba za provedbu? Podijelite uloge.

Ukoliko ste uspjeli odgovoriti na sva pitanja, čestitamo upravo ste osmislili sve detalje za izradu GIVE-BOX-a, preostaje samo da ga i realizirate u suradnji sa svojim učiteljima.









2. SCATOLA DI CONDIVISIONE (GIVE-BOX)

SCHEDA INTRODUTTIVA:

Che cos'è una give-box?

Principio: cosa riutilizzata = meno rifiuti

La give-box è una grande scatola aperta situata in un'area pubblica dove gli alunni possono lasciare e prendere articoli di seconda mano (abbigliamento, libri, giochi, fumetti, giocattoli, accessori...). Può essere un vecchio armadio, mensole, scatole, pallet - ci sono così tante opzioni. In allegato ci sono foto che possono essere una fonte di idee. Di cosa abbiamo bisogno: Un luogo accessibile al pubblico con un flusso elevato di persone. Corridoio, sala d'aspetto, cortile coperto ecc. Scaffali o scatole per creare una "give box". L'importante è che sia riutilizzabile - usare vecchi mobili, ballet, cartone, ecc.

Manifesto o bacheca: ove si spiega di cosa si tratta e qual è il principio di utilizzo, oltre alla give-box.

Quaderno in cui gli studenti scriveranno quando lasciano qualcosa (data e cosa hanno lasciato). Il quaderno deve essere legato o fissato.

DOMANDE:

- 1. Definisci un punto nella scuola dove è possibile posizionare la give-box?
- Considera quali materiali puoi usare per la tua give-box? Cosa hai a casa? Cosa dentro e intorno alla scuola? Elencare questi materiali.
- 3. Progetta l'aspetto della give-box. Fai uno schizzo
- 4. Di quali altri materiali e attrezzi hai bisogno? (colori, vernici, colle, tessuti ...) Chi può prestarti degli attrezzi o darti del materiale? Chi può aiutarti?
- 5. Pianifica come, quando e dove potresti organizzare workshop per la creazione della give-box. A scuola, a casa in gruppo? Come parte di un gruppo ecologico o tecnico?
- 6. Come presenterai il progetto e le regole per l'utilizzo della give-box? Social media o poster, volantino?
- Progetta il testo della presentazione della give-box e le regole.
- 8. É inoltre necessario un quaderno per iscrivere gli alunni che portano oggetti nella scatola di condivisione. Che tipo di quaderno, dove lo posizionerai, come lo fisserai alla scatola?
- 9. Quanti volontari devi trovare per realizzare il progetto? Assegna i compiti.

Se hai risposto a tutte le domande, congratulazioni, hai appena progettato tutti i dettagli per la realizzazione di una give-box. Ora devi soltanto realizzarla in collaborazione con i tuoi insegnanti!









Givebox Worksheet

INTRODUCTION:

What is a give-box?

Principle: reused item = waste reduction

The give box is a large, open box located in a public space where you can leave and pick up used items (clothes, books, games, comics, toys, jewelry ...). It can be an old closet, shelves, boxes, pallets - there are a lot of different options.

How do we involve young people:

• as volunteers that help create give-box during a hands-on workshop

Young people love to do practical things with their hands!

E.g. drawing a sketch of their desired give-box, painting and decorating the give-box, sanding wood...

They also like to be involved in: proposing and choosing location for the give-box, writing rules about how give-box works, bringing the first items that would be placed in give-box, helping obtain the necessary materials and tools

as users of the give-box made by young people

What we need:

- a location that is publicly accessible and where there is a large flow of young people: hallway, waiting room, covered yard, etc. (e.g. students dormitory/youth center hallways)
- shelves or boxes from which we will make a "give-box". It is important to reuse to use old furniture, pallets, cardboard, etc.
- poster or bulletin board which explains what it is and how it works
- a notebook in which young people will write when they leave something (date and what they left). Notebook should be tied or fastened to the give-box.

QUESTIONS:

- 1. Determine the location where you could place the give-box?
- 2. Think about the materials you can use for your give-box? What do you have at home? What can you find at your workplace? Make a list of those materials.
- 3. Design the look of your give-box. Draw a sketch.
- 4. What other materials and tools do you need? (paints, varnishes, glues, fabrics...). Who can lend you tools and/or materials? Who can help you?
- 5. Plan how, when and where you could have givebox construction workshops. At home, at work, in groups?

- 6. How will you present/advertise the project and the rules for using the give-box? Will you use social networks or a poster, a flyer?
- 7. Write/design a text to present the give-box and rules for using it.
- 8. You also need a notebook where people can write down their names when they bring something. Where are you going to put it, how will you attach it to the give-box?
- 9. How many volunteers do you need? Assign tasks to everyone.
